2. **Hue**- used to store kai (food) and wai māori (water)
3. **Patu Muka**- patu means to hit or strike and muka is the fibre from harakeke (flax)
4. **Tī rākau** - a fun kēmu (game) to play in pairs or groups
5. **Toki kōhatu**- used to work wood
6. **Mahe**- used for hī ika (fishing)
7. **Porotiti**- this means 'to spin'
8. **Pōtaka tā**- a tā is a whip...
